

Living up to her commitment of propagating and disseminating knowledge in the domain of Computer literacy and Computer applications amongst the general populace of the province, the Balochistan University of Information Technology and Management Sciences arranged the 6th Free IT Awareness Program from 6th August to 2nd of September, 2005. A remarkable feature of the program was that it was simultaneously conducted at the city campus as well as at the Takatu Campus of BUITMS. As usual, the program was conducted with the help of volunteer students during the semester break.

A total of 701 individuals, including people from different walks of life benefited from the program this time. Their age and gender wise break up provides interesting clues to the popular trends of future educational approaches. The learners' group comprised 602 males and 99 females. Among them were 95 boys and 19 girls below the age of 15, while 507 men and 80 women, including doctors, college teachers, engineers, journalist, shopkeepers etc. took

The opportunity of acquiring basic and advanced computer skills. This indicates that both our youths and grown; ups are fast realizing the importance of IT for moving upward in all professional spheres. The provision of physical facilities like computers and computer accessories, internet connections etc was undertaken by the BUITMS without charging a single paisa from the participants.




BUITMS Team at ITCN 2005

Plaque Unveiling Ceremony at BUITMS

12th August, 2005 was an important day in the history of Balochistan University of Information Technology and Management Sciences (BUITMS). Though its history is not very long, in fact less than 3 years, this university has established itself as a competitive, progressive and research oriented university. The students' enrollment exceeded 2000, and it was felt that the City Campus of BUITMS needed expansion to accommodate the ever increasing student strength and also to have more space for class rooms, laboratories and offices for its growing number of faculty members. To tackle this problem a development scheme for Rs. 15.00 Million, was got approved from Higher Education Commission for the construction of another floor at the City Campus. In view of the importance of Biotechnology and Informatics faculty, a vast space on the new floor has been earmarked for its class rooms and its state of art laboratories.

Taking advantage of the 5th meeting of the Syndicate of BUITMS, it was deemed fit that the ceremony for unveiling of the Plaque for the commencement of the construction of an additional floor may be held in the presence of the Chairman and the Members of the First/Founding Syndicate of Balochistan University of Information Technology & Management Sciences (BUITMS). The august dignitaries unveiled the Plaque at 8:30 P.M. on August 12, 2005 to mark the beginning of the expansion of the City Campus.

The Vice Chancellor, Dr. Muhammad Abbas Choudhary, briefed the members of the Syndicate about the City Campus which has two major faculties_Biotechnology and Management Sciences. Besides that the V.C Offices and the Administration block are also located in this building. This campus has three computer laboratories and also laboratories for Biotechnology Department.

After the completion of additional floor, which is expected within 6-7 months time, this campus will have 4 additional seminar rooms, 5 class rooms and 6 spacious rooms for the establishment of state of the art laboratories for the Faculty of Biotechnology and Informatics. The new floor will also provide office space for 18 faculty members.

The members of the Syndicate were greatly impressed by the rapid pace of progress of BUITMS and expressed their appreciation for the energy, commitment, drive and vision of the University Management. The members of the Syndicate remarked that the students of this Province were lucky to have such high standard of education and good science laboratories in the Provincial Capital. They said this university, under the leadership of the Vice Chancellor, will become a model progressive and research oriented University comparable to any foreign advanced university.



Glasgow Scholars visit BUITMS

Peter Meadows is a graduate of the University of Cambridge (M.A. Natural Sciences) and of the Open University (B.A Mathematics). He is a Chartered Biologist (C.Biol.), a life fellow of the Institute of Biology (F.I.Biol.), a life fellow of the Royal Geographical Society of London (F.R.G.S), a life fellow of Zoological society of London (F.Z.S), and a fellow of the Linean society of London (F.L.S). He has an international record of distinguished academic leadership in teaching and research in environmental science and related subjects particularly in developing countries. This includes the impact of natural hazards and biodiversity, and the organization of four international conferences with his wife. He and his 30 postgraduates at Glasgow University have published 170 publications and four books. He has participated in and organized a number of international oceanographic research cruises including work in the Indian ocean and Arabian Sea, and has led many field expeditions in a number of countries especially in Pakistan. These include the Royal Geographical society's 1999 International Hindu Kush Expedition to Chitral. He is currently an honorary lecturer in the Institute of Biomedical and Life Sciences, University of Glasgow.





Azra Meadows & Peter Medows

Azra Meadows holds M.Sc. and Ph.D degree from the University of Glasgow. She is a chartered biologist (C.Biol.), fellow of the Linnaean Society of London (F.L.S), a life fellow of the Zoological society of London (F.Z.S), and a member of the Institute of Biology (M.I.Biol.). She has an international record of outstanding leadership in environmental Management, biodiversity and rural communities, particularly in relation to Coastal zones, rivers and mountains in developing countries, especially in Pakistan. She has lectured on Environment Management at the University of Bradford and is currently doing so the University of Glasgow. Azra Meadows has published over 70 publications, including three books, and has supervised number of postgraduates. She is currently a trustee and council member of the zoological society of London. a board member of Scottish academy of Asian Arts, a board member of the Meridian Ethnic Minority Woman's centre, and chairperson of the Scottish Pakistani Association. She is also editor of the Glasgow Naturalist Journal. Azra Meadows is currently an honorary Lecturer in the Institute of Biomedical and Life Sciences at the University of Glasgow.

Peter Meadows and his wife Azra Meadows have wide work experience of and long term commitment to Pakistan, its culture, and its people. In Pakistan, they are especially interested in environmental management, poverty alleviation, rural communities and the sustainable use of natural resources. This work focuses on the coastal zone and on the mountainous northern areas of Pakistan. In the United Kingdom, they have also been involved in a number of communities orientated projects related to ethnic minorities.

In 1994, Peter Meadows was awarded the Geotechnical Medal of the Institution of Civil Engineers for his joint work with civil engineers. In 2002, Azra Meadows and Peter Meadows were separately honored with awards at the British

Muslims honors Dinner at the House of Lords, Westminster, and London. The awards were presented by the Leader of the House of Lords, Lord William of Mostyn. Azra's award citation was for promoting higher Education Exchange Scheme, rural community development, and sustainable Use of Natural resources, between the United Kingdom and Pakistan. Peter's award citation was for promoting scientific, educational and cultural Links between the United Kingdom and Pakistan.

In 2005, Peter Meadows was awarded Sitara-i-Quaidi-Azam (star of the great leader) by President Pervaiz Musharaf on behalf of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, for his and his wife's international work on education and the environment in relation to Pakistan. This award was announced in 2004 and conferred on 23rd March 2005 at an investiture ceremony in London by Dr Maleeha Lodhi, Pakistan High Commissioner to the United Kingdom.

Governor Balochistan & Chancellor BUITMS Visit to Vertical Air Tunnel Wind Turbine Research Site in Takatu Mountain

The energy sector in Pakistan is under constant threat because of the population growth, rapid industrialization and fast diminishing traditional power generation resources. The government of Pakistan has stressed upon the need for developing alternative energy sources to meet the growing needs of electricity in the country. Because of the situation in

Pakistan in general and in Balochistan in particular, it is incumbent on the scientists and engineers of the province to devise alternative energy sources to supplement the present generation capacity in order to help the government keep the electricity rates within the reach of the common man.

Keeping in view the above facts, the Honorable Governor Balochistan and the Chancellor of BUITMS, came up with a unique challenging idea of electricity generation with the help of artificially induced wind energy in contrast to the traditional method of using natural wind velocity for electricity generation. Balochistan is a mountainous and arid area and offers many attractive sites for the generation of energy form artificially induced winds. For this purpose, an experimental five feet diameter vertical steel tunnel (pipe) rising to a total height of 500 feet will be installed in Quetta Valley in the Takatoo Mountain range near Chashma Achozai, north-east of BUITMS Takatoo Campus at Baleli. BUITMS plans to install an experimental Vertical Tunnel Wind Turbine at this site for studying the suitability/ feasibility of this type of wind energy system under conditions prevailing in Balochistan. This site will also be used to test different types of Air Turbines to study the suitability/feasibility of this type of wind energy system under conditions encountered in Balochistan, and to evaluate the performance of the Tunnel and Turbines based on the data-generated and to use the results for planning and devising future experiments.

In order to select the research site and to inaugurate the project, the Honorable Governor Balochistan & Chancellor BUITMS, Quetta, Mr. Owais Ahmed Ghani along with the Worthy Vice Chancellor BUITMS, Dr. Muhammad Abbas Choudhary, visited the Takatoo Mountains on Aug 03, 2005. Other senior BUITMS faculty members were also present on the occasion. The Honorable Chancellor thanked the Vice Chancellor and especially appreciated the presence of the female faculty. Dr. Magsood A. Khan, Project Director, briefed the Honorable Governor regarding the project activities. The Honorable Governor climbed up the mountain and inspected a couple of potential sites for the installation of the wind tunnel. Finally he selected one after a brief discussion with the Vice Chancellor and other scientists present there. Then the Honorable Governor dismounted the Takatoo Mountain and came to the site where refreshments were arranged and all the faculty members and guests were waiting for him. He met all of them one by one and asked them about their respective fields and research activities. The Vice Chancellor, Dr. Muhammad Abbas Choudhary and other faculty and staff thanked the Honorable Governor for taking personal interest in the development of the project.
