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

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Editorial

8th October, 2005 was a day of devastation and destruction for Pakistan when a severe earthquake of 7.6 intensity jolted Northern Punjab, NWFP, Azad Kashmir and Northern territories and caused large scale loss of life and property. The whole nation was under a dark cloud of gloom but the destruction and devastation of the earthquake brought in its wake a glimmer of national unity and the will to rise out of calamity. The whole nation rose to the occasion to provide relief to the earthquake victims.

Balochistan University of Information Technology & Management Sciences was one of the leading institutions to pioneer the relief and rescue campaign. The fall semester, at BUIITS had got off on a festive note with the holding of a Hi-Tea party, all organized and managed by the students. On the University side the holding of the Sports Week, All Pakistan Bilingual Declamation Contest, Functions related to the 3rd Anniversary Celebrations of the University with their climax with the Honorable Governor's visit were the hallmarks of the activities in the first week of October, 2005. But all the air of festivities was darkened by the severe jolts of 8th October, 2005.

BUIITS promptly responded to the call for help and immediately started collecting relief donations. Our Worthy Vice Chancellor and his academic and administrative staff set a unique example by donating their 9 days' salaries for the cause. A relief team comprising doctors, organizers and twenty students with relief goods worth Rs. 20 lacs set out on the relief mission immediately. Another relief contingent with 850 sacks and 80 cartons of relief goods was sent by rail.

The relief team from BUIITS set to the task of rescuing the injured and distribution of relief good in the difficult hilly terrain, undaunted by the effects of inclement weather or the long distances to the traversed on foot. These are the signs of the youth of a lively nation and the youth from BUIITS stood triumphant in this test.

The bold initiative taken by the Vice Chancellor, Dr. Mohammad Abbas Choudhary inspired all and sundry to do everything possible to mitigate the sufferings of the earthquake affectees.



RELIEF OPERATION BY BUITMS FOR EARTH QUAKE VICTIMS OF 8th OCTOBER 2005

Context:

Pakistan, like other neighboring countries in the region, is among the high risk countries in terms of its vulnerability to different types of disasters. 27,312,592 people were killed or affected by disasters in the period 1999-2001.

Mechanisms in place to counter the affects of these disasters are relatively weak in Pakistan. Since 1997, several NGO's have been making serious endeavors to improve their disaster preparedness and response activities at all organizational levels. Several community based disaster preparedness trainings have been organized between 1997 and 2005 to raise disaster preparedness awareness in Pakistan and improve disaster management skills of NGO's, Volunteers/staff and Government staff.




(Rescue Work in Progress)

The 3rd of Ramadan October the 8th 2005 at 8.52 A.M saw one of the worst natural disasters in world history. A devastating earthquake of 7.6 magnitude on the Richter scale rocked half the nation causing death of thousands came as a completely unforeseen tragedy and it is to the credit of the Pakistani nation that we are coping with it as maturely as we possibly can. Many of our students participated during this

emergency and lent a hand in every possible way. 24 of our students devoted their time to practically attend to the affected people at the place of emergency. Everyone did all that was in his power to make a difference and though it obviously wasn't enough, at least we can say we tried. This earth quack has proved that we feel for our people.

In fact, the entire world, it seems, is getting a proper beating from Mother Nature. Hurricanes hit the United States of America, Earthquakes rocked South Asia and floods drowned areas of China and Bangladesh.

October 9th 2005 "the Vice Chancellor" Balochistan University of Information Technology & Management Sciences took a decision to launch the emergency fund generation in the University to support the earthquake affected people. It was decided not only to send the relief goods but volunteer students of BUITMS also would go there to physically help the earthquake affected families.

Mr. Imran Durrani Director Planning & Projects was assigned the responsibility of leading the over all activities of this operation, while Dr, Col (Retd) Anis Qureshi was given the task of supporting the team with his expertise in the health sector.

Mr. Dostain Jamaldini selected 24 student volunteers, to support this operation.

Mr., Ibrar Hussain Khan Bungash (Lecturer Bio-Technology) joined as a team member to support the operation as the camp logistic manager. Mr. Abdul Haq, Mr. Muhammad Ashraf, Mr., Gulzar Ahmed joined the team to support logistics in the operation. The services provided by Mr., M Akbar and Mr., Abdul Rauf as drivers were admirable.

The Overall objective of this operation was to assist the affected people at Balakot and the surrounding areas, in terms of health, food and other basic needs for the survival of their lives.

The activities planned to support this objective were, in brief.



- To raise the morale of the affected people, who were in a state of shock and depression due to the loss of their relatives and their assets during this earthquake.

- To support the organizations involved in ensuring health & hygiene of the people in the area.

- To establish a mechanism in the focused affected areas, so that the community should be able to perform the activities by themselves in short as well as in the long-terms.

With this in mind the team comprising 27 members advanced towards Balakot. The following student volunteers participated in this operation.

The main focus of the activities during this period was categorized as Emergency help to the affected people. Hazara University was selected as the initial

base camp for the team, but on 14th of October 2005, the base camp was shifted to Balakot, adjacent to the camps of the troops of Pak Army, from where our team was attached with the Pakistan Army troops which were ready to move to the area where no one had reached yet to help the people affected by the earthquake. The teams moved on foot towards "Ghanool" 20 kms North East of Balakot and it took 5 hours continuous walk to reach the village kholiyan where we stayed for a night and moved again towards Ghanool.

Ghanool:

Area with a population of 25,000 inhabitants a beautiful landscape of green valley with continuous flow of streams, a place where people love to stay for vacations, is an ideal place for tourists from all areas of the world. The same Ghanool became a place of horror, for the inhabitants of the area as well as for others due to the earthquake of 8th of October 2005, which killed 10,000 people there and took almost every thing from them and left them in misery (11 seconds "yes just" 11 seconds) and every thing was destroyed "Manzoor a resident of Ghanool lost his pregnant wife, his brother's family recalled the moment when the earth quack struck their village every thing went up once and then came down to the earth, nothing was left, every thing was smashed.



Activities of the relief mission:

After the establishment of the camp the first problem faced was the state of shock of the local inhabitants and they were not willing to get any medical treatment not even willing to talk. One could openly see in their eyes that they had no interest in their lives. This confirmed that there was immediate need to boost up their morale through counseling and spreading out teams in all directions of the area to reach every person of the Ghanool village. These steps made a positive impact on the attitude of the inhabitants of the area and the volunteers started making efforts to bring as many patients as they could to the base health care centre established by the German doctors team led by Mr. Morton and Mrs. Myrcia Morton. The severity of the injuries was so high that almost every second person was suffering from serious injuries. Major cases were with high septic wounds near to gangrene, legs or arms broken and skull fractures. Major injuries cases were planned to be sent on daily bases by Army helicopters, some times twice a day while the minor cases were dealt with at the spot. During our stay of 7 days in the Camp we dealt with 350 injured cases which were brought to the Camps health care centre by our volunteers or by the inhabitants themselves. Another aspect of the volunteer services was to plan and manage the distribution of the relief goods like; grocery, food, tents clothing etc; among the affected people. This aspect of the operation was also well handled by the complete team. I would like to mention here the situation that at one stage we had no material left with us for food. But due to the efforts of our volunteers along with the army troops the logistic arrangements were made by lifting the material on their backs and travel 6 Kms daily to overcome the logistic problems of the camp.

It is important to mention that we need to remember that this first earthquake period has seen numerous individual acts of heroism in the rescue and relief work, especially soldiers of the Pakistan Army who worked tirelessly day and night often at great risk to themselves to help survival. They deserve a solute one and all.

Lectures by Dr. Anis Ahmed V.C Riphah University, Islamabad

The Balochistan University of Information Technology & Management Sciences had the pleasure and privilege of welcoming Dr. Anis Ahmed, VC Riphah University, Islamabad to address the students and staff of BUITMS.

The first session for the lecture was held at Takatu Campus and the afternoon session at the City Campus. Both the sessions were presided over by the Honorable Vice Chancellor BUITMS.

Dr. Anis Ahmed is an eminent educationist, scholar and writer who has now devoted all his energies to eliminating the negative impressions of the West towards Islam. During the first two sessions, Dr. Anis talked about the importance of Ethics as enunciated in Islam and as practised in the Western World.

He stated that Ethics in the Western Society were derived from the social norms prevailing in the society. Their ethics are subject to modification with the changes in the social patterns. Legalization of gay-marriages is the obvious outcome of the social pressures. On the other hand, the ethics taught by Islam hold an unfaltering position and the adaptation of the social norms according to the prescribed ethics is stressed upon. Such a position lends permanence to the purity of life without being tagged to the boundaries of time or space. Ijtihad is the tool to ensure a continuous refinement of the prescribed ethics, subject to the condition that it does not in any way change the original nature or concept of the fixed ethics.

Dr. Anis Ahmed addressed the female staff and students of the Balochistan University of Information Technology & Management Sciences and the student of local Girls Colleges on 22nd October, 2005.

The topic of the lecture was the Concept of gender equity in Islam. Dr Muhammad Abbas Choudhary presided over the function while Mrs. Abbas Choudhary, and Prof. Mrs. Kausar Agha, Principal, Government Degree College, Quetta Cantt were among the prominent listeners.

Dr. Anis traced the scientific significance of the women-folk and asserted that in some respects, the female gender could surpass the male in performance. He stated that the West had not accepted the Muslims and was raising issues like gender equity at the cost of peaceful co-existence of both the sexes. He drew the



reueful picture of the women truck drivers in the States and of the women controlling traffic in Europe. All over the West, harassment of the women-folk is rampant in the Western society. Our females can achieve recognition without opting the norms of the West.

At the end of the lecture, the audience asked questions. The most notable question was why there had not been any female prophets throughout the history of mankind.

Dr. Anis responded to the question in a logical way referring to the peculiar biological condition of the women when they could not continue their sacred activities of prophethood and had to delegate their responsibilities to someone else. Besides this deterrent, woman could not afford to have private sessions with their male devotees nor could they have unlimited access to the masses.

On the question of co-education, Dr. Anis Ahmed stated that West doesn't mean co-education. He quoted the example of Senator Hillary Clinton who was a student of an all female institution. He remarked that segregated schools had a record of better student performance.

At the End, Dr. Abbas Choudhary thanked the honorable speaker for finding time for addressing the staff and students of BUITMS at both the campuses and providing valuable clues to the audience on ethics, society and Islam.

Balochistan University of Information Technology and Management Sciences feel great pride and honor on the commencement of Chemical Engineering Department at Takatu Campus, as promised and planned by our worthy vice chancellor to provide quality education to the people of this province and introduction of disciplines which were non existent in Balochistan before. For this purpose a four year BS degree program has been initiated in fall 2005.

The scope of Chemical Engineering is wide with myriads of job opportunities on the national and international level ranging from oil companies, refineries, petrochemical plants and other process industries such as Paper and pulp, Sugar, Food, Cement, Fertilizer industries and also in Biomedical and Nuclear fields. In addition to these there are variety of jobs for which Chemical Engineers are required like plant design, technical sales, consulting work, basic and applied research and teaching. Presently the department is managed by three experienced Chemical Engineers under the supervision of Dr. Syed Abid Hussain Dean Faculty of Engineering & Applied Sciences. The department will grow with the influx of more visiting and regular teachers in the coming semesters according to the requirement of courses going to be offered each semester. Efforts are being launched to establish state of the art laboratories for this program which will meet the current industrial demands and provide various research facilities in near future.

Cricket Matches

After playing against each other, the teams which qualified for the Semi Finals were: BS(BC)B, Textile, MBA(A) and BS(BA)A.

In the 1st Semi Final, BS(BC)B were given a walkover as their opponent Textile did not turn up at the ground at the scheduled time. The 2nd Semi Final was played between MBA(A) and BS(BA)A at Qasim Stadium. In this stunning match MBA(A) narrowly clinched victory when the last wicket of BS(BA)A tumbled at 86 runs in pursuit of 90 runs target set by MBA(A).

In the Final which was played between MBA(A) and BS(BC)B at Bugti Stadium, MBA(A) outplayed BS(BC)B by putting up a huge total of 208 runs on the board. 
Basketball Matches
